

# **Mock Trial Judge FAQ**

#### What do I need to do before the mock trials?

- 1. Register: Complete your registration <a href="here">here</a>.
- 2. Complete Orientation: Complete the online orientation for <u>High School</u> or <u>Middle School</u>.
- 3. Read Case Materials: Review the case materials for High School and Middle School.
- 4. Review Rules: Each judge should be familiar with the Mock Trial Rules. The high school rules can be found <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>. The middle school rules can be found <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>.

If you are a presiding judge, familiarize yourself with the Modified Rules of Evidence here.

# How will I know where to go?

The Mock Trial Coordinator will send instructions regarding check-in locations before the trials.

## How will I know which courthouse/courtroom I will be judging in?

At check-in, an announcement will be made specifying the courthouse and courtroom for each presiding judge and scoring panel.

#### I've never done this before, is that okay?

Yes! We provide all the training you need to judge effectively.

# Can I judge if my child is participating?

No, immediate family members of participating students may not judge. However, you are welcome to watch the trials in which your child is involved.

## Can I be the presiding judge?

It depends. Presiding judges are typically current or former members of the judiciary or experienced mock trial volunteers.



# What if I recognize a competing student or teacher coach?

Per Rule 5.2.B, a judge must excuse themselves from a trial if they have a conflict with either team, such as helping a team prepare, being a relative or close friend of a student or coach, or any other relationship that might prevent impartial judging. Casual recognition from prior mock trials usually doesn't require disqualification unless a closer relationship exists.

## Can I be a scoring judge on the same panel as my friend?

Efforts are made to balance scoring panels. First-time judges typically won't be placed on the same panel unless necessary.

# Where do we go between rounds?

Lunch will be provided in the jury assembly room after rounds 1 and 3 of the high school competition and after round 2 of the middle school program. You're welcome to stay and enjoy lunch after submitting your electronic ballot. Breakfast will also be served before rounds 1 and 3 of the high school competition and before round 1 of the middle school program.
